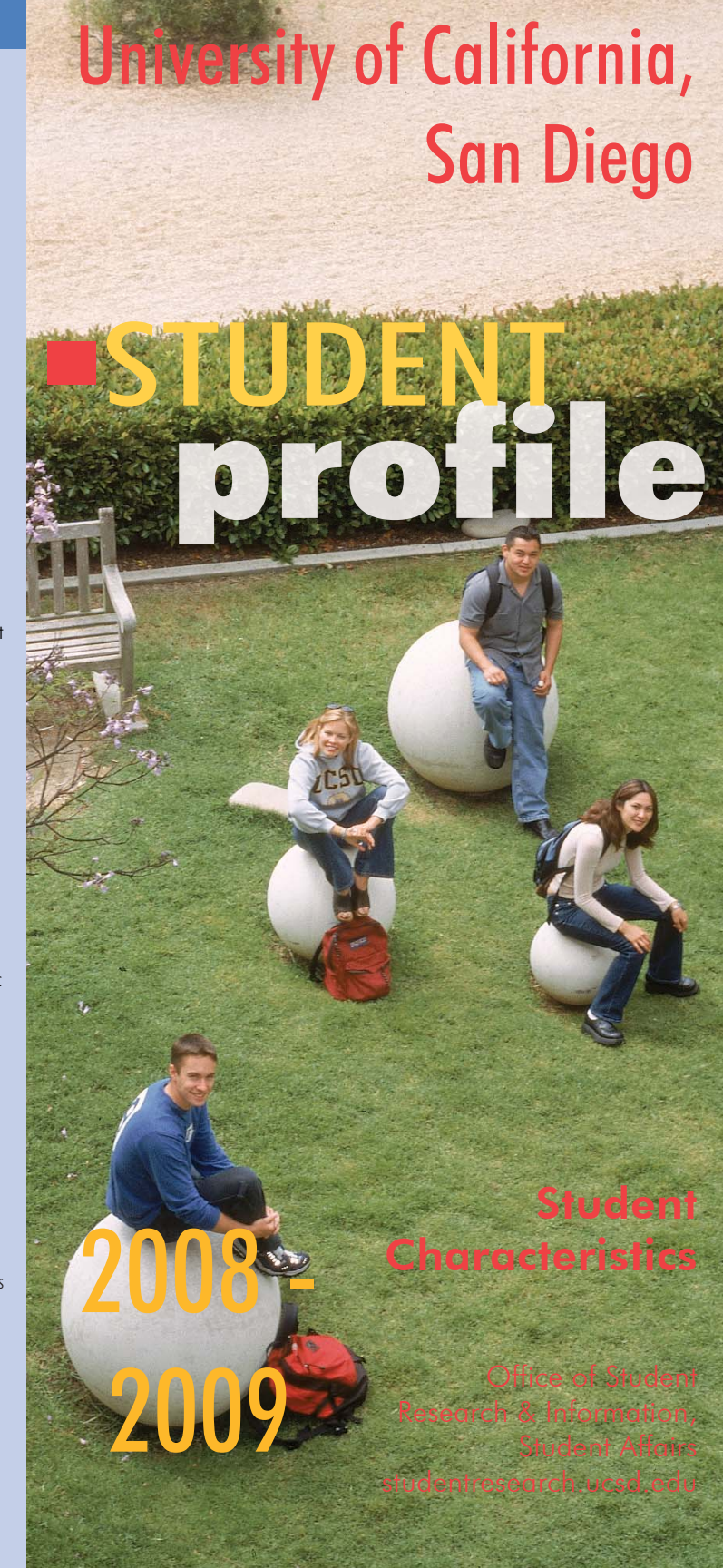
The average transfer GPA for the 2008 transfer cohort was 3.33. Eighty-two percent of all transfer matriculants had GPAs of 3.0 or higher.

HOUSING

In Fall 2008, approximately 33% of all undergraduates live in on-campus housing. The types of student housing include residence halls, single undergraduate apartments, and married student apartments.

On campus residence halls and single undergraduate apartments accommodate 7,480 students: 3,900 in residence halls and 3,580 in apartments.

Mesa, Coast, and Single Graduate Apartments comprise 1,252 apartments housing 2,123 students and approximately 723 family members when applicable.

La Jolla Del Sol apartments (faculty, staff, graduate students and upper-division undergraduates) include 381 condominiums housing 164 faculty, 112 staff, 197 graduate and upper division students, and 285 family members approximately.

Approximately 92% of the Fall 2008 entering class of freshmen were housed on campus in residence halls or apartments.

STUDENT COSTS

University fees for the 2008/09 academic year total approximately \$8,062 for full-time California resident undergraduate students. Non-resident undergraduate students pay an additional \$20,021 non-resident tuition and \$587 education fee. Graduate students fees are \$10,076 for California residents. Non-resident tuition for graduates is \$14,694 with a \$312 education fee. These fees are subject to change.

The exact cost of attending the University of California, San Diego will vary according to personal tastes and financial resources of the individual. Generally, the total expense for three quarters, or a college year, is estimated at approximately \$23,760 for California residents living in University housing.

FINANCIAL AID

In 2008-2009, approximately 63% of all undergraduate students are expected to receive some type of financial assistance from a wide variety of programs including Federal, State, UC and outside sources in the form of loans, grants, work-study and scholarships.

SCHOLARSHIPS

For the 2008-2009 academic year, UCSD estimates administering \$4 million in scholarship support for undergraduate students from UC and gift and endowment sources. This includes approximately \$874,000 in Regents Scholarships.

Notable awards to graduate students in 2008 included 50 National Science Foundation fellowships, 169 U.S. Public Health Service traineeships, and 28 Medical Science traineeships.

STUDY ABROAD

During the 2007/08 academic year, 975 students were abroad participating in academic and experiential programs at more than 150 institutions in over 75 foreign countries through the University's Education Abroad and Opportunities Abroad Programs. UCSD students received over \$475,000 in special study abroad scholarships to support their study abroad sojourns.

CAREER SERVICES CENTER

Last year, the Career Services Center posted over 11,500 off-campus part-time listings, over 2,500 internship listings, and over 2,900 on-campus listings (does not take into account students remaining in position from previous year or rehires). Many of the listings in all categories have multiple openings.

GRADUATION RATES-UNDERGRADUATES

Over four-fifths of all students who begin their undergraduate studies at UCSD complete their degree requirements at UCSD. The six-year graduation rate for the 2001 freshman cohort is 84%. The four-year graduation rate for the 2003 community college transfer cohort is 81%.

TIME TO DEGREE

The average time-to-degree is currently 4.2 years (or 12.7 quarters) for students who entered UCSD from high school. For community college transfer students, the average time-to-degree is 2.7 years (or 8.2 quarters).
