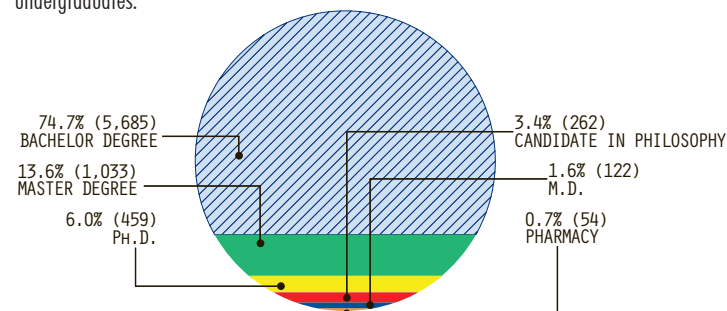

TOTAL UCSD ENROLLMENT

UCSD enrolled almost six thousand graduate and medical students, and over twenty-three thousand undergraduate students.

DEGREES CONFERRED

In 2009/2010, UCSD awarded a total of 7,615 degrees; of these, 75% were awarded to undergraduates.

HOUSING

In Fall 2010, approximately 36% of all undergraduates live in on-campus housing. The types of student housing include residence halls, single undergraduate apartments, and married student apartments.

On campus residence halls and single undergraduate apartments accommodate 8,145 students: 3,473 in residence halls and 4,672 in apartments.

Mesa, Coast, One Miramar Street, Warren Single Graduate Apartments and the Rita Atkinson Residences comprise 1,534 apartments housing 2,535 students and approximately 773 family members when applicable.

La Jolla Del Sol apartments (faculty and staff) include 381 condominiums housing 199 faculty, 117 staff and 264 family members approximately.

Approximately 92% of the Fall 2010 entering class of freshmen were housed on campus in residence halls or apartments.

STUDENT COSTS

University fees for the 2010-11 academic year total approximately \$11,330 for full-time California resident undergraduate students, along with an \$870 health insurance fee/allowance. Non-resident undergraduate students pay an additional \$22,021 non-resident tuition and \$858 education fee. Graduate student fees are \$12,488 for California residents. Non-resident tuition for graduates is \$14,694 with a \$408 education fee. Please note, some graduate programs have different costs and additional professional fees. All fees are subject to change.

The exact cost of attending the University of California, San Diego will vary according to personal tastes and financial resources of the individual. Generally, the total expense for three quarters or a college year, is estimated at approximately \$27,858 for California undergraduate residents living in University housing or off-campus.

FINANCIAL AID

In 2010-2011, approximately 70% of all undergraduate students are expected to receive some type of financial assistance from a wide variety of programs including Federal, State, UC and outside sources in the form of loans, grants, work-study and scholarships. This includes need and non-need students.

SCHOLARSHIPS

For the 2010-2011 academic year, UCSD estimates administering \$4.4 million in scholarship support for undergraduate students from UC and gift and endowment sources. This includes nearly \$1.2 million in Regents Scholarships.

Notable awards to graduate students in 2010 included 75 National Science Foundation fellowships and 185 U.S. Public Health Service traineeships.

STUDY ABROAD

During the 2009-2010 academic year, 1,075 students were abroad participating in academic and experiential programs in over 55 foreign countries through the University's Global Seminars, Education Abroad and Opportunities Abroad programs. UCSD students received over \$480,000 in special study abroad scholarships to support their study abroad sojourns.

CAREER SERVICES CENTER

Last year, the Career Services Center posted over 4,850 off-campus part-time listings, over 1,450 internship listings, and over 2,650 on-campus listings (does not take into account students remaining in position from previous year or rehires). Many of the listings in all categories have multiple openings.

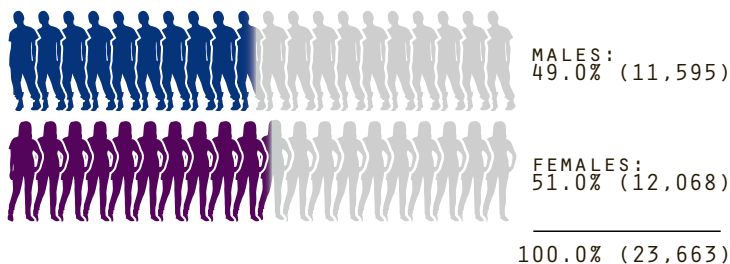

UNDERGRADUATE ENROLLMENT

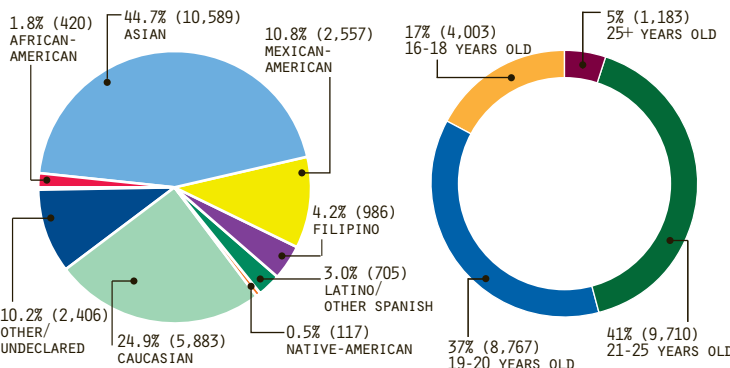
GENDER

At 51%, women represent the majority of undergraduate students on the UC San Diego campus.



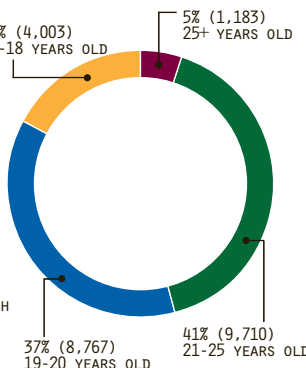
ETHNICITY

The undergraduate student body at UCSD is ethnically diverse; approximately 65% of undergraduates are students of color.



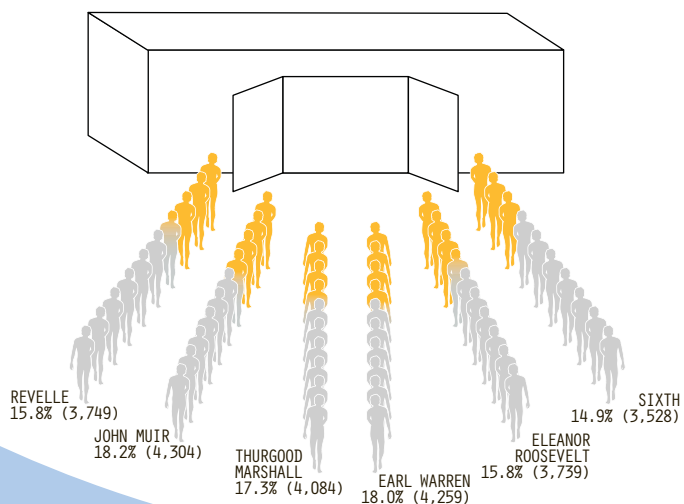
AGE

The average age of undergraduates is 21 years; the vast majority are under the age of 25.



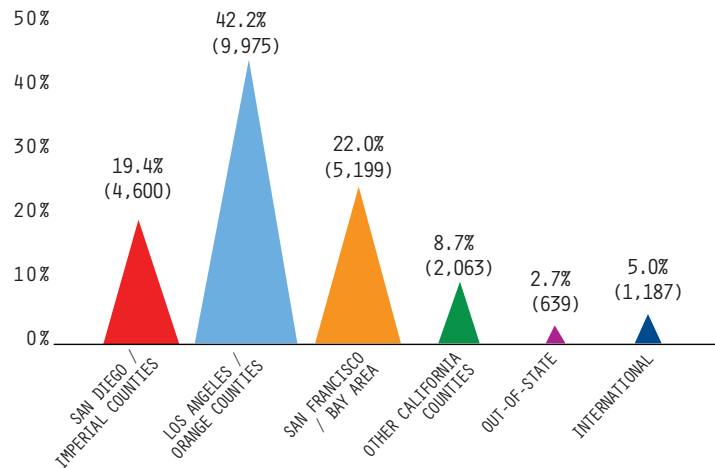
UNDERGRADUATE COLLEGES

Currently John Muir and Earl Warren Colleges enroll the largest number of undergraduates.



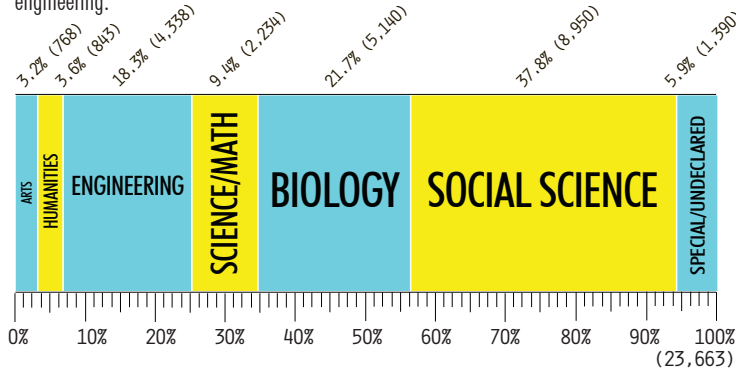
GEOGRAPHIC ORIGIN

93% of all undergraduates are from California. Out-of-state and international students represent approximately 7% of the undergraduate student body.



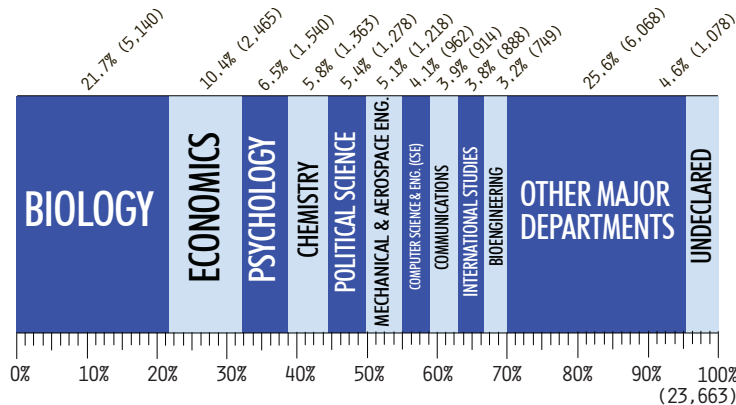
FIELDS OF STUDY

NEW STUDENT ENROLLMENT

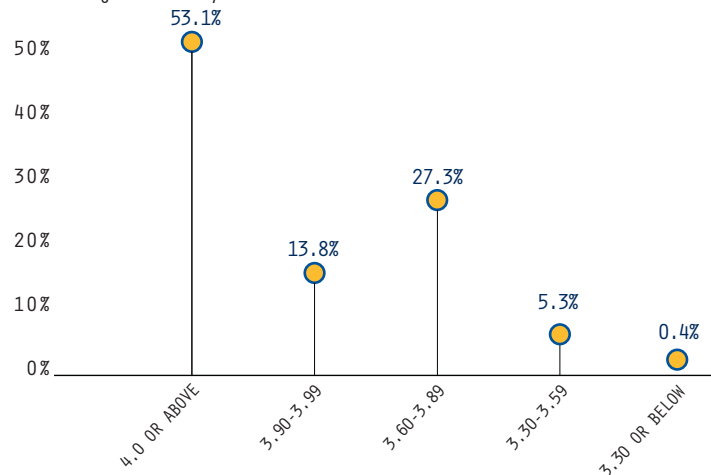
A total of 6,515 new students enrolled in classes in the Fall 2010 term. At 2,568, this is the largest transfer cohort to date.



FIRST-TIME FRESHMEN

HIGH SCHOOL GRADE POINT AVERAGE

The average high school GPA for the 2010 freshman cohort was 3.98; over one-half had GPA of 4.0 or higher. GPAs may exceed 4.0 due to credit for honors courses.



HONORS COURSES

The average number of honors courses taken in the 10th and 11th grades for the 2010 freshman cohort was 4.



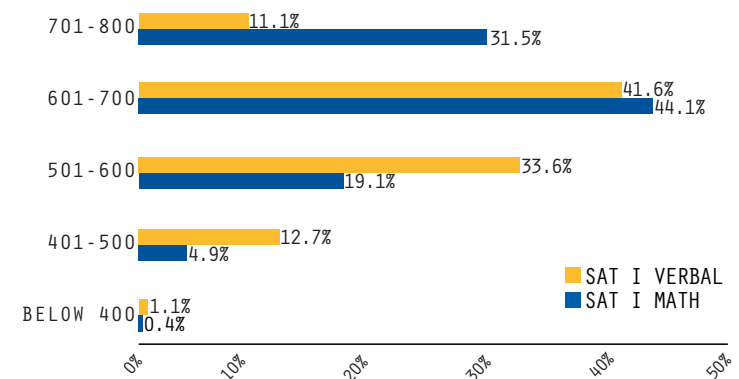
COLLEGE PREPARATORY (A-G) COURSES

For the 2010 freshman cohort, the average number of A-G semester courses completed in high school was 48. The minimum A-G course requirement is 30 semester courses - 14 of which must be taken during the last two years of high school.



SAT SCORES

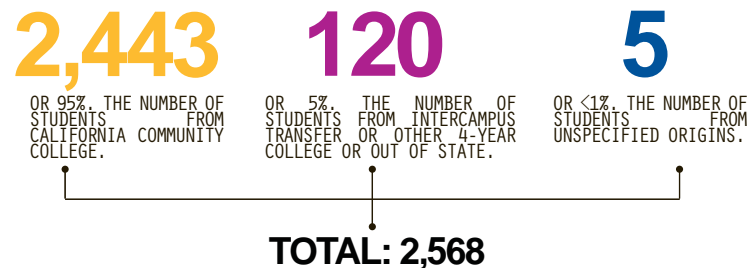
The average SAT I composite score for the 2010 freshman cohort was 1265. The average SAT I Verbal and Math scores were 604 and 660, respectively.

TRANSFER INSTITUTIONS

The vast majority of transfer students attend California Community Colleges prior to enrolling at UCSD.



TRANSFER GRADE POINT AVERAGE

The average transfer GPA for the 2010 transfer cohort was 3.42. 91% of all transfer matriculants had GPAs of 3.0 or higher.
